# Be Curious



Weekend

Two days of family fun, exploration and learning



The historically significant Beaumanor Hall is a superb setting for experiential and empathetic exploration for both children and adults. The site has a rich history and some elements of that provide a focus for several activities, with higher-level thinking skills predominating, whilst the grounds and natural resources enable a series of challenges more reliant on a combination of creativity, physicality and effective team-working skills.

#### **Tickets & Prices**

Be Curious Weekend is designed as a **family activity weekend**, that is, families working and playing together. All children must have adult supervision in each session. There is an expectation that participating parents will not just supervise – they will join in the activities.

If more than one parent/guardian is attending, both are welcome to join in the activities with their child(ren) but the second (or further) adult(s) can opt for a 'Non-Participating' ticket. In this case they will have access to site and refreshments, but they will not be permitted to join in the activities.

Each day is divided into a morning and an afternoon session. These can each be filled with either 2 one-hour sessions or a single two-hour session.

Potential Plus UK are working in partnership with The Skills Builder Partnership aiming to build the essential skills which children and young people need for success. Our programme offers opportunities to help children and young people develop their abilities in the eight key areas and guidance on particular matches between activities and skills is provided using the symbols against activities. Further details will be available on the day.

















#### **One Hour Sessions**

#### 1) Bridge Building

Try your hand at some structural engineering as you work as a team to design, build and test a bridge to span a body of water. Explore and experiment with knot-tying, physical balance and mechanics in order to get your team safely across to the other side - without getting wet! Shoes with good grip that you don't mind getting damp should be worn for this activity. Most people don't get too soaked doing this activity (unless they really want to!), but a change of items of clothing might be handy to have if you are that super-adventurous sort.







#### 2) Land Buggies

Work with your team to build your own buggy using barrels and poles in an attempt to create the most effective vehicle to then race against the other teams in a series of challenges. Success will depend on planning, design, engineering know-how, team work and leadership - as well as having resilience and a good sense of humour!







#### 3) Nightline

A sensory deprivation exercise in which participants are blindfolded throughout the activity. Teams support each other to navigate their way through a series of obstacles with trust, communication, cooperation and mutual support all being key to reach a successful outcome







### 4) Team Challenges A & B

Team Challenge A contains different activities to Team Challenge B. These two challenge sessions each use a number of exciting physical and mental games and puzzles. You will need to problem-solve, lead, evaluate, co-ordinate and work as a team.

#### 5) Pond Dipping & Mini Beast Hunting

The Beaumanor grounds are teaming with wildlife, large and small, even more so postlockdowns. The woodland, pond, stream and meadow areas provide the ideal backdrop to learn about habitats, natural art, creature study and classification both on land and in the water. Scientific activities and games that facilitate exploration.







#### 6) History Tours

Explore the Hall and grounds and hear about the fascinating connections Beaumanor Hall has with both the Victorian era and World War II particularly.





#### 7) Bushcraft

Explore the theme of survival and man's basic survival needs including building effective shelters in the woodland to protect against the elements.





#### 8) Y-Station Code-Breaking

During World War II, Beaumanor was instrumental in the effort to break the German enigma code. Absent from the maps of the time, it blended into the local landscape unseen. Participants will get to work in one of the camouflaged buildings from the era - it might look like a workers' cottage but it is the original radio-building! You will be challenged to work swiftly and competitively to listen with care to real messages and decode them.







#### **2 Hour Sessions**

#### **Adventure Options**







These activities provide a technical and specific skill-based environment where participants can challenge themselves physically and mentally to overcome fears and work on building self-confidence and independence. Please note age, weight and height guidance for these.

**Canoeing** – minimum age 6, must be able to swim confidently Please be aware that there is a short minibus journey required and that you are likely to get wet.

Archery – minimum age 6

**Climbing** – minimum age 6 – minimum height 1.25m – weight range 20-101kg

**High Ropes** – minimum age 8 – minimum height 1.25m – weight range 20-101kg This involves an aerial trek and a zip wire.

#### **Kit List Considerations**

- ➤ Please come prepared for all weathers. All activities take place outdoors. We have indoor spaces available for breaks and breaktimes are sufficiently long to allow for changes of clothing.
- The **weather** at this time of year can be changeable so please bring items of clothing to accommodate both wet and sunny spells (eg. Waterproofs, sun cream/hats).
- Some activities Bridge Building, Canoeing and Pond Dipping take place on or near water, so having a change of clothing and/or footwear available is strongly advised.
- ➤ Be prepared for **muddy** and slippy conditions sturdy boots or wellies are worth considering, plus wearing clothing that you do not mind getting dirty.
- For those activities involving a harness High Ropes and Climbing please make sure that legs are covered (leggings or a trouser, no shorts please).
